EDITORIAL

IEC 2016, Liturgy, Lent and Mercy

This week's Dayly Knightly references the <u>International Eucharistic Congress</u> which just ended on Jan 31st last in Cebu, the Philippines. It has proved to be a major shot in the arm for faithful Catholics with <u>millions of people</u> taking part in the nine day event. In this newsletter, Pope Francis's letter to the IEC in Cebu and a presentation made by His Eminence Bishop Barron are highlighted.

Recently, issues regading the distribution of the Holy Communion to church-goers who choose to kneel, to receive the Blessed Host, have come to the fore, here in Tokyo. In fact, it has been an issue throughout the world since the end of Vatican II in 1965. Though most parishes today distribute Holy Communion in the hand as the norm, it can in fact be received kneeling should the communicant choose this way. This is encoded in Canon Law of the Catholic Church and backed not only by the Vatican but also by the Catholic Bishops Conference of Japan. At the end of last year, St. Ignatiius Church in Tokyo indicated that the practice of distributing Holy Communion to those who kneel had ended but this is not so. Communicants at St. Ignatius can still receive the Blessed Host in either one of both ways that is supported by the Catholic Church in Japan, namely on the hand or by kneeling. This issue of Dayly Knighly covers a number of articles and video presentations on this topic.

Cardinal Robert Sarah is also featured. He is the Vatican's Prefect for the Congregation of Divine Worship which is the body of the Church which handles issues concerning the sacraments. Cardinal Sarah has consistently voiced the position that communicants can receive the Blessed Host not only on the hand but also by kneeling and on the tongue. It seems though that there is confusion and misunderstandings on this ruling of the Church, both in Japan and abroad, which sadly can lead to the humiliating situation of a communicant being refused the Blessed Host and even being publicly scolded by the priest. On one occasion in Tokyo, the priest even stooped so low as to try to physically force a female communicant to stand. Whatever the reasons, and in the spirit of the 'Year of the Jubilee of Mercy', wouldn't it be a sign of the love and patience of Christ to allow a communicant to kneel if he or she so chooses? Even a simple request to communicants to wait till near the end of the distribution of the Blessed Host to receive it by kneeling would be one way to overcome the issues concerning this situation. Pope Francis asks us to be merciful and not to be so caught up on rule interpretions. This situation can be a great act of mercy and healing - a new Lent.







On certain matters to be observed or to be avoided regarding the Most Holy Eucharist

Distribution of Holy Communion

"[91.] In distributing Holy Communion it is to be remembered that "sacred ministers may not deny the sacraments to those who seek them in a reasonable manner, are rightly disposed, and are not prohibited by law from receiving them".[177] Hence any baptized Catholic who is not prevented by law must be admitted to Holy Communion. Therefore, it is not licit to deny Holy Communion to any of Christ's faithful solely on the grounds, for example, that the person wishes to receive the Eucharist kneeling or standing."

Regarding the posture at the moment of receiving Holy Communion

"3. Regarding the posture of communicants the Institutio Generalis Missalis Romani states that "the faithful communicate either kneeling or standing, as determined by the Conference of Bishops." According to this norm, in Japan, depending on the place where the Mass is to be celebrated and except in the case of those who are unable to stand for some special reasons, as a general rule, Holy Communion is received standing. When the faithful communicate with a common posture, as well as showing a sign of the unity among those attending Mass, 3 it also helps towards a smooth flow of the procession of the faithful. However, it is not licit to deny Holy Communion to any of Christ's faithful solely on the grounds that the person wishes to receive the Eucharist kneeling.4"







Catholic Saints & Feast Days - Jan 29 - Feb 06 2016

Excerpts and articles from various sources on the lives of our Catholic Saints. This week, we focus on a giant in the Catholic Church, Saint Thomas Aquinas for whom a special page is devoted. The excerpts below are available from AMERICAN CATHOLIC.



January 29 - Brother Juniper

"Would to God, my brothers, I had a whole forest of such Junipers," said Francis of this holy friar. Brother Juniper joined the friars in 1210. Francis sent him to establish "places" for the friars in Gualdo Tadino and Viterbo. When St. Clare was dying, Juniper consoled her. He was devoted to the passion of Jesus and was known for his simplicity.

It is said that St. Francis once described the perfect friar by citing "the patience of Brother Juniper, who attained the state of perfect patience because he kept the truth of his low estate constantly in mind, whose supreme desire was to follow Christ on the way of the cross" -



January 30 - Saint Hyacintha of Mariscotti

Hyacintha accepted God's standards somewhat late in life. Born of a noble family near Viterbo, she entered a local convent of sisters who followed the Third Order Rule. However, she supplied herself with enough food, clothing and other goods to live a very comfortable life amid these sisters pledged to mortification. How differently might Hyacintha's life have ended if her confessor had been afraid to question her pursuit of a soft life! Francis of Assisi expected give and take in fraternal correction among his followers. Humility is required both of the one giving it and of the one receiving the correction; their roles could easily be reversed in the future. Such correction is really an act of charity and should be viewed that way by all con-

Francis told his friars: "Blessed is the servant who would accept correction, accusation, and blame from another as patiently as he would from himself. Blessed is the servant who when he is rebuked quietly agrees, respectfully submits, humbly admits his fault, and willingly makes amends"



January 31 -- Saint John Bosco

John Bosco's theory of education could well be used in today's schools. It was a preventive system, rejecting corporal punishment and placing students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. He advocated frequent reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion. He combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance, seeking to unite the spiritual life with one's work, study and play. John Bosco educated the whole person—body and soul united. He believed that Christ's love and our faith in that love should pervade everything we do—work, study, play. For John Bosco, being a Christian was a full-time effort, not a once-a-week, Mass-on-Sunday experience. It is searching and finding God and Jesus in everything we do, letting their love lead us. Yet, because John realized the importance of job-training and the self-worth and pride that come with talent and ability, he trained his students in the trade crafts, too.



February 01 - Saint Ansgar

The "apostle of the north" (Scandinavia) had enough frustrations to become a saint and he did. Ansgar's biographers remark that he was an extraordinary preacher, a humble and ascetical priest. He was devoted to the poor and the sick, imitating the Lord in washing their feet and waiting on them at table. He died peacefully at Bremen, Germany, without achieving his wish to be a martyr. One of his followers was bragging about all the miracles the saint had wrought. Ansgar rebuked him by saying, "If I were worthy of such a favor from my God, I would ask that he grant me this one miracle: that by his grace he would make of me a good man."

Februarry 02-- Presentation of the Lord

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.


In Luke's account, Jesus was welcomed in the temple by two elderly people, Simeon and the widow Anna. They embody Israel in their patient expectation; they acknowledge the infant Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. Early references to the Roman feast dub it the feast of St. Simeon, the old man who burst into a song of joy which the Church still sings at day's end.



Febriary 03 - Saint Blaise

We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary Acts of St. Blase were written 400 years later. According to them Blase was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals.

The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.



February 04 - Saint Joseph of Leonissa

Joseph avoided the safe compromises by which people sometimes undercut the gospel. Born at Leonissa in the Kingdom of Naples, Joseph joined the Capuchins in his hometown in 1573. Denying himself hearty meals and comfortable quarters, he prepared for ordination and a life of preaching.

In 1587 he went to Constantinople to take care of the Christian galley slaves working under Turkish masters. Imprisoned for this work, he was warned not to resume it on his release. He did and was again imprisoned and then condemned to death. Miraculously freed, he returned to Italy where he preached to the poor and reconciled feuding families as well as warring cities which had been at odds for years. He was canonized in 1746.



February 05 - Saint Agatha

St. Agatha, born in Sicily of noble parents, suffered a glorious martyrdom at Catania In the persecution of the emperor Decius. For when Quintianus, the praetor of Sicily, had vainly tried every means to tempt her from her virginity, he had her arrested as adhering to the Christian superstition. First she was beaten, then tortured on the rack with white hot iron plates laid on her; then one of her. breasts was cut off. Next she was thrown into prison, where St. Peter the Apostle appeared to her by night and healed her. Again called before the praetor she persevered in confessing Christ, and he had her rolled over broken pottery and burning coals. But then a great earthquake violently shook the city, and Ouintianus, afraid of a riot among the people, gave orders that Agatha, now half dead, secretly be taken back to prison. 


Nagasaki, Japan, 26 martyrs of Japan were crucified on a hill, now known as the Holy Mountain, overlooking Nagasaki. Among them were priests, brothers and laymen, Franciscans, Jesuits and members of the Secular Franciscan Order; there were catechists, doctors, simple artisans and servants, old men and innocent children—all united in a common faith and love for Jesus and his Church.

Brother Paul Miki, a Jesuit and a native of Japan, has become the best known among the martyrs of Japan. While hanging upon a cross, Paul Miki preached to the people gathered for the execution: "The sentence of judgment says these men came to Japan from the Philippines, but I did not come from any other country. I am a true Japanese. The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ. I certainly did teach the doctrine of Christ. I thank God it is for this reason I die. I believe that I am telling only the truth before I die. I know you believe me and I want to say to you all once again: Ask Christ to help you to become happy. I obey Christ. After Christ's example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain."

When missionaries returned to Japan in the 1860s, at first they found no trace of Christianity. But after establishing themselves they found that thousands of Christians lived around Nagasaki and that they had secretly preserved the faith. Beatified in 1627, the martyrs of Japan were finally canonized in 1862. Today a new era has come for the Church in Japan. Although the number of Catholics is not large, the Church is respected and has total religious freedom. The spread of Christianity in the Far East is slow and difficult. Faith such as that of the 26 martyrs is needed today as much as in 1597. Read article here...

Cardinal Sarah says the Christian family counters both Islamic, Western extremism

Vatican City, Oct 14, 2015 / 03:57 pm (CNA/EWTN News).- Cardinal Robert Sarah has told the Synod of Bishops they should respond to the twin threats of Western and Islamic radicals by helping the world realize the beauty of the Christian family.


"To use a slogan, we find ourselves between 'gender ideology and ISIS.' Islamic massacres and libertarian demands regularly contend for the front page of the newspapers," the cardinal said last week in his intervention at the synod. "From these two radicalizations arise the two major threats to the family."

He compared the twin challenges of "the idolatry of Western freedom" and Islamic fundamentalism to two "apocalyptic beasts."

Cardinal Sarah, the Guinea-born head of the Congregation for Divine Worship, said he hoped the synod would help Pope Francis "enunciate clearly truths and real guidance on a global level."

He especially advocated that the Church promote the "epiphany of the family."

Background:

Two of the investigators behind the undercover Planned Parenthood videos face up to 20 years in prison after a Houston grand jury decided on Monday (Jan. 25) not to charge Planned Parenthood with any wrongdoing – and, bizarrely, instead indicted them for offering to purchase human organs from the abortion provider as part of their investigation!

David Daleiden and Sandra Merritt's cameras caught the director of research for Planned Parenthood Gulf Coast, Melissa Farrell, seemingly admitting to multiple felonies, including making a profit from human organ trafficking and altering the abortion process unnecessarily in order to get "the best specimens."

"If we alter our process, and we are able to obtain intact fetal cadavers," she said in the fifth CMP video, which also featured actual graphic footage of the dissection of a fully-formed 20-week-old aborted baby inside its Houston abortion facility. Farrell even states that the fees paid for fetal body parts adds tremendous "diversification of the revenue stream" for the Planned Parenthood affiliate.

But rather than charge Planned Parenthood for illegally selling baby body parts, Center for Medical Progress investigators David Daleiden and Sandra Merritt face a second-degree felony charge of "tampering with a governmental record," and a misdemeanor charge for violating the state's "prohibition of the purchase and sale of human organs."

That is, jurors in the state of Texas are accusing Daleiden and Merritt of trying to illegally traffic in aborted babies' body parts, even though he only did so as part of an undercover investigation into Planned Parenthood's inhuman practices..

The felony charge alone carries a punishment of not less than two, and not more than 20 years in prison, and a fine of up to \$10,000.






Called to forgive: 'If we hate ISIS, then they have won' - By Oliver Maksan
